JANUARY


Steering Committee Retreat in Maine

JULY

American Scientific Affiliation Conference



At ASA 2025, faithful STEM professionals and academics gathered to talk about technology and theology. While YECA was there to share about climate communication, we had the opportunity to also engage with the men and women working on solutions for a cleaner, safer tomorrow.

Christian Climate Observer's Program at COP30



Past and present YECA folks reunited in Belém, Brazil for COP30. As members of the Christian Climate Observer's Program, they observed negotiations and engaged in important climate conversations, all from a Christian and missional perspective.

Witness for Christ, Witness for Climate Giving Campaign



In early December, we kicked off our end-of-year giving campaign. We created testimony videos from members of our network, sharing how they see their efforts with YECA as a witness for Christ and for our climate. Thanks to the generosity of our supporters, we raised over \$10,000 for more bold and faithful action in 2026.


Faithfully Advancing Sustainability Together (FAST) Conference



For the second year in a row, YECA had a presence at Calvin University for this wonderful gathering of Midwest Christian colleges. YECA tabled at the conference to share our mission with students, and Lauren led a breakout session detailing climate change discussion techniques.

Celebrating Community Fellows



This year, our Community Fellows blew us away with their creative and collaborative efforts. Beyond raising awareness for climate change at their churches through faithful conversations and writing, they magnified their impact by starting a creation care podcast, *Rivers in the Desert*.

2025 HIGHLIGHTS

YECA was busy in 2025. Here are some of our favorite, most impactful moments.

Making Headlines

In the Spring, two of our 2024-2025 College Fellows had their work featured at impressive levels. Rinah F. had an op-ed published in [The Gospel Coalition](#), writing beautifully on the importance of our “hope-infused Christian creation ethic.” In Indiana, Becca B. was spotlighted in a [New York Times](#) article on creation care efforts at Christian churches and universities.

In August, YECA Staff testified to the EPA opposing the repeal of the foundational Endangerment Finding. The hearings, with quotes from Jaime’s testimony, were featured in [The Guardian](#).

Serving Neighbors

YECA’s award-winning College Fellowship Program has helped us establish a consistent presence at certain universities. One 2025 College Fellow, Maddie B. at Taylor University in Indiana, continued working with a Stewards of Creation Club established by a previous YECA Fellow. A highlight of her fellowship year was organizing weekly community meals to address food insecurity in the area. Maddie partnered with a community food pantry and local farmers and utilized produce from Taylor’s own campus garden to provide a fresh, locally sourced meal and extra produce for students and families to take home.



Defending Climate Progress

Throughout the Spring and Summer, YECA worked to defend the climate progress we’ve made in recent years, including the passage of several key pollution safeguards and clean energy tax credits for churches, schools, and homes. As the Trump Administration and Congress took steps to reverse and roll back these critical wins for our climate, our network submitted hundreds of petitions, letters, statements, and testimonies opposing these steps in the wrong direction.

These policy rollbacks reiterated what a critical time we are in for our climate. The presence of young leaders and faithful voices in these moments is more important than ever. This fight is not over and in 2026 we plan to continue boldly advocating for a healthy and just environment for future generations.



Staff Salary & Benefits - \$119,293.36 (84.5%)


